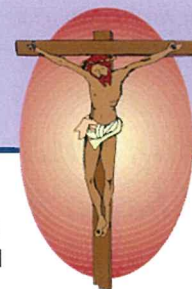
Our next fortnight's Triple A Social Skill is **Excellence**

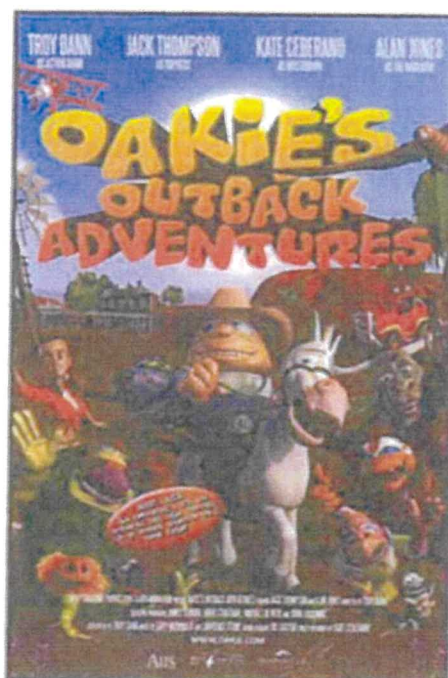
