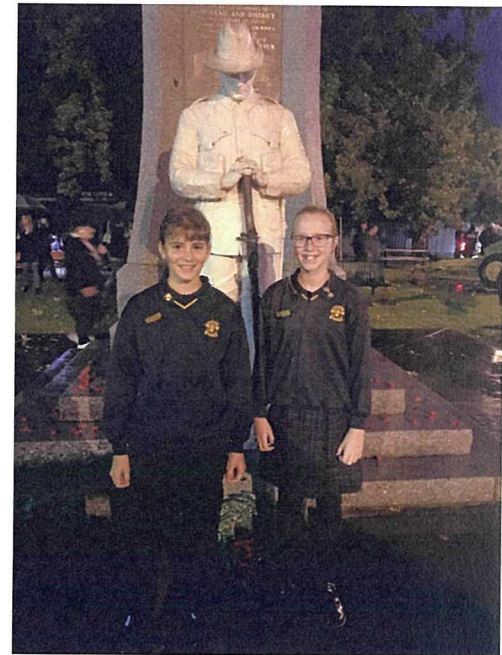

Maths

We have been working on addition and subtraction using real life scenarios and concrete materials. We are working on making the problem, drawing it and writing it. We continue to work on our number formation and counting patterns. Counting by 10's, 5's, 2's and 1's both forwards and backwards. You can assist your child by practicing these skills, particularly number formation.



Literacy



This term we are focusing on Word Generation, this simply means we are looking at patterns in words and we ask children to create as many words that have the same letter endings. For example the 'ot' family consists of words such as hot, cot, pot etc. Another focus is using the THRASS chart to help us recognise the 44 different sounds in the English language. If you would like more information about the THRASS Chart please come and see us.

Keep reading at home and continue to practice your coloured words children!

The letters/sounds we are focusing on this Term are Rr, Dd, Ff, Bb, Hh, Ii, Uu, Vv, Ww, Yy and Zz.

R.E.

In RE we have been looking at Mothers and how important they are. We have spoken about Jesus' Mother Mary. The Assembly plays a big part in our RE topic.

Inquiry Topic

This term our topic is called 'Discovering Australia.' We will be investigating what Australia looked like before white settlement. We will be helping children understand the connection the Indigenous Australians have to this land and how we can look after this beautiful country.

Juniors

We hope everyone had an enjoyable and safe Easter break and feel settled into Term 2.

Inquiry

Our topic for term 2 is focused around Sustainability where we will be exploring life cycles of plants and animals. We will be growing a variety of seeds observing different rates of growth in a range of conditions. This topic will be a fun, hands on unit of learning.

Literacy

This term in Literacy we have begun working on Procedural Writing and how clear instructions are vital to carry out tasks. We will also be exploring the aspects of Report Writing linking to our Inquiry topic. Students have responded to our class big books with character profiles and creative book responses. We have started our spelling word activities and are also working on our handwriting and letter formation. Our Reading groups are in full swing with students participating in a range of activities to suite your child's literacy needs

Religion

Last week we looked back at Easter Sunday and spoke about the resurrection of Jesus. We shared how this was/is a very joyful time in the Church's calendar. Students were able to reflect upon their learning by showing us the order of events that took place in Holy Week and what happened in each. We have now moved on to a new topic on 'Creation', which links in with our Sustainability unit.

Mathematics

We have finished our topic on '2 and 3D Shape' and have moved into 'Multiplication and Division.' This is an area where students will be representing their thinking of 'groups of' by using drawings, counters and skip counting patterns. We encourage students to use their most efficient counting strategies to assist with multiplication and division problems. As we work through this topic, it would be useful to create some worded problems at home for your child to solve.

Specialists

Junior East has LOTE and Sport while Junior West has Art and Library until half way through this term. At this time we will swap our sessions.






Fruit/Water

Please continue to ensure your child has a water bottle and fresh fruit snack each day. Our 10 o'clock fruit break is important for helping children get through the morning period. Please label all containers and bottles with your child's name.

Homework

To support your child's learning at school we expect our Junior students to spend some time each night reading with you. Please record your child's home reading in the yellow Log Books as **this is the only way we know you have been reading with you child**. Children have the best chance of success when they are reading both at home and at school.

At the end of Term 1, we developed an understanding of Jesus's sacrifice for us as we retraced his last days. Students learnt of the significance of Palm Sunday, Holy Thursday and the Easter story. Last week we looked at the 102th year of Anzac Day and learnt how important it is to remember the brave sacrifices these men and women made for us.

We encourage both children and their families continue to develop their faith through their involvement within the parish.

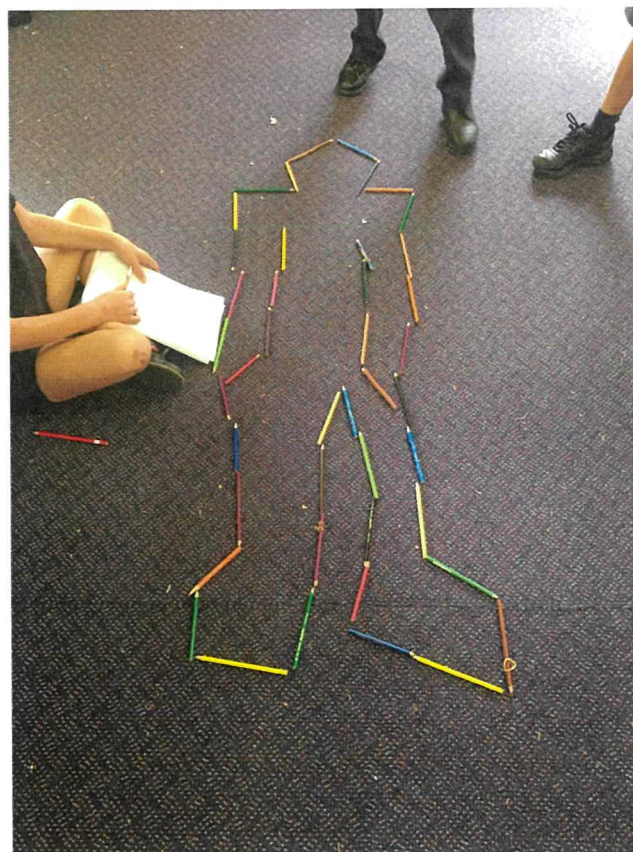
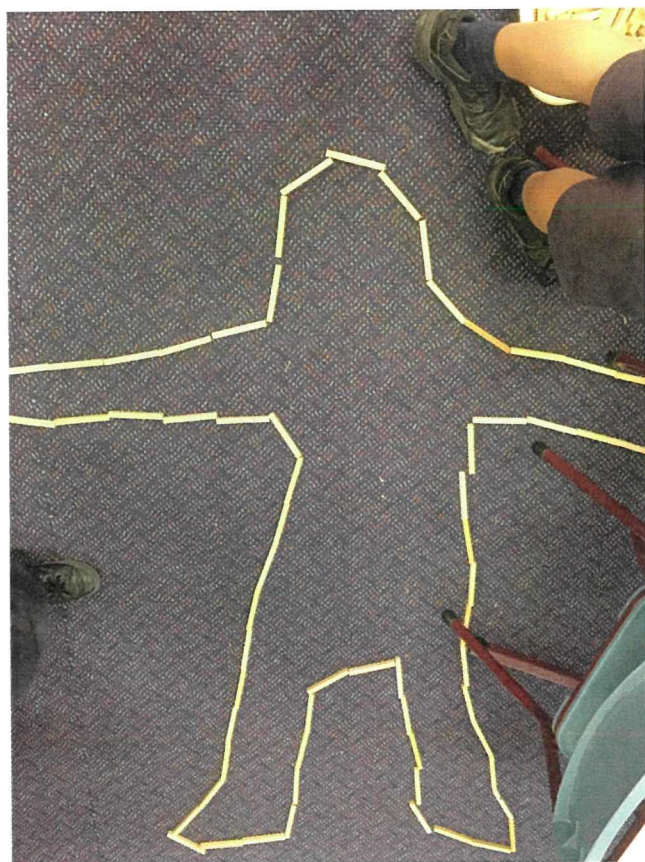
In mathematics we have been looking at different ways that we can measure, including length, area, perimeter, time, mass, volume and capacity. Through this students have been able to draw comparisons between our mathematics and real life scenarios such as fencing our backyards.

Our Inquiry Topic for the term is 'Digging up the dirt on Dinosaurs'. Students find this topic really exciting as they are investigating all the different types of dinosaurs that once roamed our Earth. Students are able to explore their wonderings and discover through science exploration. The children have posed questions such as, "How big was the T-Rex? What is the smallest/largest dinosaur?, How do we know so much about dinosaurs? Which was the most deadly dinosaur to encounter? We look forward to going on a learning journey with our students as we discover some of these answers.

The year three students are preparing for the upcoming NAPLAN Assessments commencing week 4. In both Numeracy and Literacy students will undertake a series of Australia wide assessment tasks over a three day period. To date the students have prepared for these by writing Persuasive Texts on topics such as "It's cruel to keep animals in cages", "All school students should wear a school uniform" and practicing Narrative Writing by using sentence and visual starters.

Whilst in Numeracy all students have engaged in Problem solving activities that involve all aspects of mathematics, our focus currently being shape. We take this opportunity to wish all year 3 and 5 students well in the lead-up to this quite rigorous assessment time.

Consistent with previous practice, and following the 2016 Australian Bureau of Statistics *National Census of Population and Housing (Census)*, it is timely that information held by the department is updated in order that Australian Government funding calculations for your child's school are accurate.

Under section 21 of the Regulation, a *statement of addresses* must not explicitly identify an individual. Accordingly, all information in the *statement of addresses* provided by your child's school to the department is de-identified.

Use and Disclosure of Information

It is important to ensure the *statements of addresses* are accurate, and the department may from time to time audit *statements of addresses* to verify their accuracy. In the event of an audit, the department's auditors may seek to compare a school's *statement of addresses* with student enrolment information held by the school for the purpose of verifying the information. The department's contractors will not use the information for any other purpose.

Any further use and disclosure of information relating to the *statement of addresses* will occur in accordance with section 65 of the Regulation.
