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




As you know, we recently hosted an all-school event called **The NED Show**. We trust your child was encouraged by the show, which inspires everyone to become Champions at school and in life!

It is hard to believe that our students are already working through Week 3 of Term 3! The students have settled back into our living and learning routines well and we are excited by the opportunities this term will provide.

100 Days at School


The Prep students will be celebrating their 100th day of school Tomorrow 2nd August. We will participate in games, craft and many more enjoyable activities to mark this special day. We would like to invite all families to our shared lunch outside the MacKillop Centre at 12.45pm

Literacy

In Reading, the students have been working hard to build stamina as they now know how to sound out and decode new and challenging words. It is great to see our students improving their confidence as they are developing a self awareness of being able to read for meaning and enjoyment. This has been supported through our daily Sounds-Write and Phonological Awareness lessons.


In Writing, the students have been learning how to structure and extend simple sentences by including the When, Who, What and Where. We are encouraging our students to develop their own ideas by thinking about "who" their writing is about, "what" events take place", "when" did the events happen and "where" are the characters. It is wonderful to see the student's writing really beginning to emerge, improve and grow at this time of the school year.





Numeracy

In Numeracy, the students have been revising their knowledge of Place Value. They have been learning about the value of a digit in a number and have been using concrete materials to represent this. They have continued their counting skills, including skip counting by 2s, 5s and 10s as well as forwards and backwards



from given numbers. Next week we will begin to focus our attention towards Addition and Subtraction where the students will extend their understanding by solving more complex problems.

Religion

In Religion, the students have been learning about 'Our Church.' They have developed their understanding of belonging as it relates to family, school, community and parish. We have identified the Church as a community of people who come together to celebrate faith and discussed that when we celebrate as a Church community, we feel like family.

Inquiry

In Inquiry, the children have been learning about the Olympics. We have been looking at the history of the Olympics, the Olympic rings and the torch relay. The Prep children were lucky enough to have a visit from Eli's Papa, Vern who brought in an Olympic torch he got to carry before the Sydney Olympics in 2000. We had our own torch relay and made our own torches.



Juniors

We are off and racing into Term 3! Our classrooms are like an Olympic village with our living and learning routines all centered around this special event. Students are getting into the spirit exploring the history of the games and learning about this year's host country.

Olympics STEM Show

Over the next few weeks students will be investigating some sports from the games this year. Students will complete a poster about that sport and research an Australian Athlete representing us this year in Paris. The teachers have selected matching STEM tasks for students to complete for each sport. These miniature versions of the sports are made with craft supplies and explore how we can use forces to make movement. We will be having an open classroom afternoon/morning for parents/carers/friends to visit and try their skills at our STEM sports. This will be in Week 5 on Thursday 15^{th} (3pm – 3:45pm) and Friday 16^{th} (8:30am – 9:30am).





<u>Literacy Block – Fruit Break</u>

Our literacy block is very full in the mornings with Sounds Write, Reading Groups and Writing. We thank you all for helping to make our busy morning easier by putting fruit in a separate container to enable children to put this on the table at the beginning of the day. The children are enjoying our new routine.

Numeracy

We have spent the first few weeks looking at money. We have had many conversations about the value of money and representing amounts using different coins. Students enjoyed watching the video of the Royal Australian Mint and how coins are made. If you are in the supermarket, feel free to challenge kids with calculating amounts.

Our next topic will be looking into Data and Fractions.

Religion

In Religion, we have been learning about "How we grow in God's Love".

Students are learning about the unique gifts that God has given each of us and how we must make use of these gifts and share them with others. In the coming weeks we will explore the "Parable of the Talents" and the message Jesus was sharing with his disciples about not wasting the gifts we receive instead using them to serve others.



We have looked at the image below with some guiding questions.

- What does this mean to you?
- What is in the boys hands?
- What does the light represent?
- How is the boy feeling about what is in his hands?
- Where would you find God in this image?

• What message could this image be sending us about God's gifts?

Resilience Project

Students love our Monday Resilience Project lessons, and we are starting to see the Happy Tricks (Gratitude, Empathy and

Mindfulness) come out during our daily living and learning. A great lesson that has flowed into Term 3 was around Helpful and Unhelpful reactions to situations. We had some rich discussions about our reactions which can be difficult to control in the moment. As we are continually learning we will remind, model and support students to work on helpful and unhelpful reactions starting with knowledge and identification. Another great part of our day is where we bring in mindful activities to take away from the hustle and bustle of life to focus in on one thought, activity or moment. This can be done through colouring, focus tasks, meditation, breathing exercises, yoga and even just sitting trying to do nothing. Here are some snaps of Junior East trying their best at yoga focusing intently on the slow movements of their body.









Homework (Routine continues)

<u>Phonics</u> A reminder that children have a phonics book with weekly focus words for children to practice at home. We encourage children to write these words at least twice a week.

Nightly Reading Hints

We ask that all students please read to an adult every night. Once completed, please write the title and a small comment in their reader diary.

When reading at home together, before reading, predict the story, look through the illustrations using the language in the book, stop halfway and share what you think might happen next, check your predictions at the end. Finally ask your child to retell the story checking comprehension.

Developmental Play

On Friday afternoons students participate in developmental play. This is a great opportunity for children to work on their social skills, communication, problem solving and imaginative play. Students often love working with building materials and the dramatic play tubs. We have been encouraging students to play board games to work on their strategic skills and turn taking. Do you have a favourite board game your family likes to play? If you have any unused games that have all the pieces which you would like to donate to our classroom, please let your teachers know.

Specialist for Term 3

Students have specialist classes on <u>Wednesdays</u>. Children need to continue to wear their <u>sports uniform</u> every Wednesday and Friday. They also need to bring their Library bag each Wednesday.



Middles

The Middles have hit the ground running in Term 3, embracing the winter season while eagerly anticipating the arrival of spring. This 10-week term is packed with activities, including incursions, excursions, and engaging learning experiences in all our core subjects.

Religion

Last Wednesday, twelve students in the Middle School completed their reconciliation in preparation for their First Communion. This term, our focus is on the seven sacraments of our church, which are signs of God's presence in our lives. Unlike other signs, sacraments truly bring about what they represent, making them the most important celebrations in our Church. We will also celebrate the Feast Day of our school's patron saint and founder, Saint Mary MacKillop.



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<u>Inquiry</u>

Our students are diving into the wonders of space this term, culminating in an exciting excursion to The Discovery Science & Technology Centre in Bendigo during Week 8. They will participate in activities such as marble runs, planetarium visits, a vertical slide, and other space exhibits. We will depart from the school at 8am and return by 4pm. More details will be sent home with your child in the coming weeks.

Literacy

In the next few weeks, we will celebrate the Olympics with a visit from our very own Olympian, who will share his experiences of the games. Encourage your child to tell you who this person is and what event they competed in—how lucky we are to have him at our school! Our students are also using the writing process to plan, write, and publish informative reports. They will create triaramas showcasing the ancient games, modern games, various events, and athletes they admire.



Numeracy

Our students have just completed their unit on shapes and are now embarking on a four-week unit on fractions and decimals. We provide a range of learning experiences to allow students to demonstrate their understanding in different ways. Through dynamic small group work, we cater to all learning needs, continually challenging our students. As the term progresses, we will explore mass and weight, and conclude with statistics and probability.

We have launched into a new English focus discovering everything there is to know about natural disasters. This unit is very engaging for the students and provides them with interesting facts about major events that happen on a global scale.


Inquiry / Production

The students that are participating in inquiry are starting a project to create their own Rube Goldberg Machine. This machine is based on using a set of different reactions to solve a problem. It will be interesting to see what the students create.
