## KEN SHELDON

A former Australian rules footballer in the Victorian Football League. He is the father of the Brisbane Lions' player Sam Sheldon. Recruited from Miamo, Sheldon, a rover, debuted with the Carlton Football Club in 1977. He wore the Number 5 guernsey. In 1979 he kicked 53 goals and topped Carlton's goalkicking for the year. Ken is remembered for receiving the ball from the sliding Wayne Harries and kicking the winning goal to give the Blues a premiership win over Collingwood in 1979. Ken Sheldon is a three time Carlton premiership player and ex St Kilda player and coach.

## SHELLEY O'DONNELL

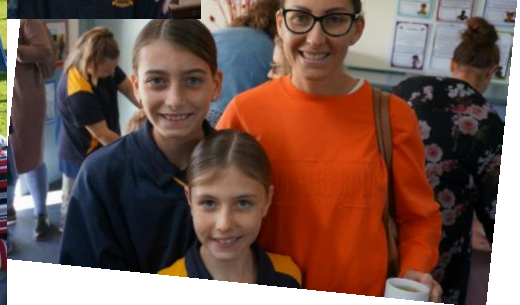
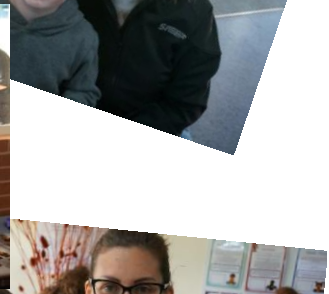
Netball Hall of Fame inductee and former Australian Vice-Captain Shelley O'Donnell will join Dan and Ken.

A prolific Centre, O'Donnell's record both playing and coaching speaks for itself. She formed part of the World Cup winning Australian teams in 1991, 1995 and 1999 the latter as Vice-Captain.

In an international career spanning 10 years O'Donnell represented her country on 84 occasions, further to this she was also the inaugural captain of the Melbourne Kestrels between 1997-2000.
