PREP

We are almost at the end of Term Two and the time has absolutely flown by! The children have been busy learning and are very deserving of the upcoming break. We would like to take this time to congratulate all our families for their support, hard work and dedication to Remote Learning. It has been wonderful to have the children back in the classroom to finish out the Term together.

SMART Spelling & Reading

We encourage our students to continue to practice their SMART spelling words and read their reader with an adult each day. This will greatly support their reading and writing progress and will reinforce what we are learning at school.

Literacy & Inquiry

Our Literacy and Inquiry has been closely linked this term through our unit 'Living and Non Living Things.' The children have enjoyed learning about life cycles and discovering what living things need to survive. We were fortunate enough to further develop our understanding through the hatching of the chickens and planting of the bean seeds in our own classroom. The children have enjoyed gathering information on this topic and celebrated their learning by creating an Information Report on chickens. Over the next two weeks the children will be creating a diorama for a living thing of choice that includes the things they need to survive. We ask that each child please bring a cardboard box to school to complete this activity.

















Numeracy

Over the past 2 weeks we have been focusing on Place Value and looking closely at numbers in the teens. The children have looked at bundling to 10 and using MAB blocks to make numbers. We continue to count daily to 100 or even higher. The children are practicing skip counting by 10's, 5's and 2's. For the final 2 weeks of Term we will be looking at money. The children will explore what money is, what we use it for and what the value of different coins and notes are. If you have any special coins or money from different countries that you would like to send along, it would be great to be able to share and talk about this.







Religion

In Religion we have finished our topic on Prayer and are now looking at 'God Knows Us and Loves Us.' During this topic we look at families and what makes a family. We also look at God's unconditional love for us.

JUNIORS

Literacy

In Literacy we are continuing to meet the needs of all students. We are doing this by grouping the whole Junior level into ability groups rather than seeing the Junior level as Junior East and Junior West. We are currently exploring different forms of poetry such as, colour poems, shape poems and acrostic poems. As we look at each type of poem, students are deconstructing the writing process into planning, composing and publishing. Students are thoroughly enjoying the opportunity to write, publish and share their beautiful writing.

Writing in the Spotlight

Pink

Readers

We ask that all students please read to an adult every night. Once completed please write the title and a small comment in their reader diary. Students will also be required to read every morning when they arrive at school before they go outside to play.

SMART Spelling

A SMART Spelling homework book is sent home each Monday. Students are encouraged to practise their words on a minimum of two nights by saying the word, sounding it out and writing it. We ask that this homework book returns to school every Friday.

Numeracy

Recently in Maths, our students have been learning all about Fractions. These learning experiences have included a variety of activities including naming, identifying and creating fractions. One such activity challenged our students to find pictures of objects, and then to cut and paste them into fractions on a poster, as you can see in the attached photos. Next the students were asked to explore, discuss and share their findings, demonstrating an understanding of what a half,





quarter, whole and more complex fractions look like on their poster.

Religion

In Religion we are currently looking at 'Jesus in Scripture'. Students are developing their awareness that the Bible is a special book for us and that it includes stories about Jesus as well as stories that Jesus told. Reading and responding to Gospel stories allows students to see that Jesus is our teacher and that he can guide us in making good choices and decisions.

SENIORS

What an incredible term we've had together! We are so proud of how well the children and families have adapted to the many changes we've had in the last few weeks.

<u>In Class</u> - In Religion we are looking closely at the bible and important 'Sacred Stories'. In Literacy, the students are working on their Public Speaking performance and the topic is based around Sustainability. We are learning about how to summarise texts using our own words. In Maths, Division is the current concept we are learning about. We have been continuing to focus on different strategies for mental computation, algorithms and have worked on improving our times table recall to support us in dividing bigger numbers.

Festival of the Sacred - Over the past few weeks we have been working on our dancing skills in preparation for the Festival of the Sacred. We have received a lot of support from the professional dancers from ASPA and the professional Mrs Hall, Mr Merkel and Mr Harber. We can't wait to show off our performances to the whole school later this term.

Winter School Sports - After all inter-school sports being cancelled in 2020, the students were super excited to have their first game yesterday against Numurkah Primary School. We have stressed to the students that the Year Sixers take priority during winter sports. When we play smaller schools there may only be a small group of Year 5's involved, depending on numbers. This is one of those special Year Six experiences.









Production - It's that time again! We are all gearing up for our Senior Production. This year, our production will be "A Kidsummer Night's Dream." The students have just completed their auditions and the students were given their roles on Tuesday, which they are very excited about. We will begin rehearsals next term and can't wait to show everyone our talents.

Uniforms - Just a reminder we are now in the midst of winter, therefore it is an expectation that all children wear the winter uniform, including their jumpers when outside. If your child wishes to wear a beanie it must be a school beanie.

Diary signing/Homework - Please also remember to sign your child's diary each night. The school diary is the key method of communication between a parent and teacher. Homework consists of a maths sheet, writing task, spelling activities and nightly reading.

VACATION CARE

This term in Vacation Care, we are giving the children the opportunity to learn to sew. We will be running sewing on Tuesday 29th June and Thursday 8th July. The children can make a cushion or a bunting. We will also have a football and netball clinic with some up and coming local stars. Also the children will have the opportunity to cook, craft and play games.

Bookings are now open for Vacation Care, which shall be running again during the school holidays Tuesday, Wednesday & Thursdays 8am to 4pm. The cost shall remain the same, \$60.00 per day with Child Care subsidies also provided. Children will need to bring their own lunch, snacks and water bottle. If your child is already enrolled in the Before & After School Care Program, then you can book via the My Family Lounge App just like Before and After School Care.

If you have not used the program before, then you will need to enrol your child/ren. If you have never used the My Family Lounge, you will need to register and request a booking. Once your request has been accepted, (usually within 48 hours) you will need to complete an enrolment for each child. Please note that this will need to be completed on a desktop computer as not all functions work on a tablet or phone. Once completed, please click on the submit tab as this will send your information to our system. You will need to acknowledge that you are using our service via your MyGov account to receive any Child Care Subsidies. This may also include completing details regarding your employment and/or personal family situation. You will now be able to download the My Family Lounge App to manage your bookings.


If you wish to start using the program, please contact the office for enrolment information before the end of Term.
