### Preps

Welcome back to our fourth and final term for the year. What a buzz there has been around the classroom! It has been wonderful to be back onsite with the children and we look forward to finishing out the year with normal routine and consistency. We would like to thank everyone for continuing to follow the kiss and drop rules and adapting to the changes. This term we have welcomed Tim Arnel into the Prep Area as an extra teacher. Tim has been a wonderful addition to our living and learning routine.



### SMART Spelling & Reading

We encourage our students to continue to practice their SMART spelling words and read their reader with an adult each day. Once completed please write the title and a small comment in their reader diary. Please encourage your child to check their understanding of the book by asking questions about the text or having your child retell what they have read.









### Literacy & Inquiry

In Literacy our focus has been linked with Inquiry where we are looking at 'Terrific Tales.' The children have been learning about the features of a fairy tale, comparing and contrasting fairy tales and retelling fairy tales by looking at the beginning, middle and end. We have also re-started our reading groups. During this time all Prep students join together and then split into small ability groups.

### Numeracy

In Numeracy, the children have been consolidating their understanding of Number and Place Value. They have been focusing on reading numbers, writing numbers and ordering numbers. They will now revise number operations and strategies used to solve worded problems for addition, subtraction, multiplication and sharing.



### Religion

In Religion, the children have been learning about ways we can live like Jesus. They have been exploring how we can care for ourselves and others and sharing ways in which they can be kind to people just as Jesus showed us.

### <u>Specialist</u>

The children need to continue to wear their **sports uniform** every Tuesday and Friday. They also need to bring their Library bag each Tuesday.



### Uniform & Water Bottles

We ask that all children wear their summer school uniform. Children must bring their hats to school. Anyone without a hat will be asked to sit under the shade at recess and lunch. Due to COVID safe rules, all children must bring a labelled water bottle to school.

### Juniors

### Literacy

In Literacy we are learning about non fiction texts, in particular information reports. Exploring this type of texts allows us to link our Literacy with Inquiry as we read, view, analyse and create pieces of writing based on the past, present and future weather. This week students are beginning to research a natural weather disaster of their choice and will create a written and/or oral report.

### **Readers**

We ask that all students please read to an adult every night. Once completed, please write the book title and a small comment in their reader diary. Students will also be required to read every morning when they arrive at school before they go outside to play.

### SMART Spelling

As a part of our school wide SMART Spelling program we have one spelling sound per week. On a Monday, students will be introduced to our new sound and each day they will complete spelling activities that aim to improve their sound knowledge and allow students to learn their words for that particular week. A SMART Spelling homework book is sent home each Monday. Students are encouraged to practise their words on a <u>minimum of two nights</u> by saying the word, sounding it out and writing it. We ask that this homework book returns to school every Friday.

### **Numeracy**

Recently in Maths our students have been learning all about Perimeter, Area, Capacity and Weight. Students have explored the relationship between perimeter and area by using a range of formal and informal measurements. Capacity has allowed us to venture outside by using water and sand to investigate the capacity of different containers.

Next week, we will begin to revisit Multiplication and Division. Students developed a good understanding of basic strategies to solve equations earlier in the year. Throughout this unit we will further develop these skills while assisting students to increase their use of mental strategies.











### I'm a Mini Meteorologist

Our Inquiry topic this term is 'I'm a Mini Meteorologist'. We are investigating the world of weather, by exploring the daily forecast, the wind, and natural disasters. We are encouraging students to be the class Meteorologist by delivering a morning weather report highlighting all the important details of the day. Please analyse and explore the weather daily with your child and discuss with them what we have learnt.








### Seesaw

### Seniors



#### Dear Parents and Caregivers,

We are writing to inform you that the school will be transitioning to an online management system called PAM (Parent Access Module) over the term, with an aim of having all families using the system by the start of the 2022 school year.

The purpose of moving to an online system like PAM is to continue improving and refining the communication and information sharing between the school and families. When PAM is fully operational and families are logged on to it, we hope it will make life a little easier, as well as being far more environmentally friendly with less paper work going home in the bottom of school bags!

As the school and families transition to PAM, specific modules will be released so that families can:

- get the most up to date information and resources regarding what's happening at school
- inform the school of your child/s absence or late arrival
- update child/s medical medical information
- be informed if your child/ren have needed First Aid during a school day
- provide consent for excursions & school activities.

The first step in transitioning to PAM is to get families logged on and familiar with the system. More information will be provided over the term when different functions are released. Please follow the steps below to register and log in.

#### Action Required

- an email would have been sent to you from noreply@yourschooldomain that contains instructions and a link for them to click on. Please check your JUNK or SPAM mailbox if you do not receive an email.
- click on the link in the email and follow the instructions to set your password and verify your email address:

- Once your email address has been verified, this email address can be used as the username for that account.
- If you would like to change your password at any point, you can go to the three-line, Main Menu icon and then select 'My Settings'. Enter details into the 'Change password' boxes. NOTE that an email address must be verified BEFORE any password change is attempted.
- Once you have successfully logged in, you can save PAM to your phone's home screen (process will differ depending on which phone you use). The PAM icon looks like this:



The staff continue to be amazed and excited by the possibilities of PAM and we look forward to providing you with further information and support about PAM throughout 2021/22. If you do have any questions about PAM, please do not hesitate to contact the School Office or your child/s classroom teacher. We would like to thank all parents who have connected to PAM and have patiently supported us, as we continue to learn to navigate this new management system and all that it provides.
