Vinnies Winter Sleepout

On Friday 5 August 2022 a group of brave Year 6 students slept rough as part of the Vinnies Winter Sleepout. For those courageous students, the aim was to raise awareness and money for those in our community that don't have a safe and secure place to sleep. The challenge was simple: give up one night in a warm, comfortable bed and sleep on the cold floor of the school's Mary MacKillop centre. Some of these students even realised that to sleep in the Mary MacKillop Centre was a luxury compared to some of the places individuals have to sleep in at night.

Over the night students came together to learn about homelessness, hear stories of those that sleep rough and celebrate the work of dedicated volunteers. These volunteers use the money raised through nights like this to help feed, house and look after the most vulnerable in our community. In the end the students raised over \$4000 and hopefully have a newfound appreciation for all they have in their own lives, in particular their beds.
