



Many of you will be familiar with attending the Children's Mass on Christmas Eve at 6pm in the Mackillop Centre. Unfortunately, that Mass won't be possible this year as Fr Jophin needs to celebrate the 6pm Mass in Nathalia

This letter is to inform and invite you to our Parish Celebration in the church on Christmas Eve which begins with Carols at 7.30pm followed by Mass at 8pm.



At the conclusion of the Carols, just prior to the start of our Parish Mass at 8pm, we have the tradition of inviting the parents of a new baby to place their baby in the empty manger reminding us that Jesus came into our world as a vulnerable, dependent little human. Some young children have always attended the parish Mass so the baby & parents have been accompanied by angels and sometimes shepherds and kings.

So this year we extend the invitation to all children attending to come dressed as angels, shepherds, kings or other, and join in that procession. They would then sit by the manger for a couple of songs before returning to their parents.

When?

Tuesday, Wednesdays & Thursday from the 3rd January until the 19th January 2022, 8am to 5pm.

What do we bring?

You will need to bring your own snacks, lunch & water bottle.

What activities will we do?

We will offer a range of activities including sporting games, craft, cooking, indoor games and many more!

Cost?

It will cost \$60 per child per day, less any child care subsidies you may receive.

Who is the program open to?

The Vacation Care program is open to all current St Joseph's students, that are aged 12 years and under, including the current Year 6s and the new Preps.

How do I register my child/ren?

If you are already using Before & After School Care, you can book via the My Family Lounge App as you would for any casual bookings, select Vacation Care.
