Everyone has the right to be heard if they do not feel safe or see another student in need.

Students at St Joseph's know that they can always approach a staff member with a concern and they will be taken seriously.

Purpose



The teachers and LSOs have committed to keep children safe.

The teachers and staff in the school know what to do if a student says that they feel unsafe or worried about anything.

Commitment to Child Safety

Risk Management



St Joseph's School knows that it is important to keep our school safe.

The school looks for problems or things that might be unsafe and then if there are any problems the school will fix them straight away

We should always tell a staff member if we see a risk

Code of Conduct



St Joseph's School makes sure there is a **Code of Conduct** for all teachers, LSOs, administration staff, Fr Michael, emergency teachers, parent helpers and other volunteers and workers that clearly explains the behaviour that they need to show.

This **Code of Conduct** is available on the school website and in the office.

Hired Staff and Staff Training



Before employing staff and helpers, St Joseph's School checks their background to see if the person is suitable to work with children.

Some of the things the school does to make sure they are right for the school are:

- Check if there is a police criminal record
- They can be given a trial time
- Make sure that they sign the Code of Conduct
- Make sure they are nice to students
- Make sure they follow the rules as well
- Check that they have a Working with Children Check
- See what they did for their last job
- Mr Arnel talks to the people that worked with them last to see if they are safe people.

Once they have settled into St Joseph's School they get more information and training about child safety.

Inclusion and Empowerment for all students and Young People



All the staff and teachers at our school help the students to understand that they have a right to feel safe and secure.

The School Captains play an important role in making sure we know that we have the right to be safe.

Classroom activities help us to understand our rights.

There are signs and posters in the school informing us that our school is a child safe school and what we can do if we feel unsafe.

Students at St Joseph's can speak up.
