Vegetable Frittata



Cooking time: 35 minutes

- Olive oil spray
- 500g frozen stir-fry vegetable mix, thawed (if you can include fresh vegetables of your choice instead that's even better!)
- 6 eggs 125ml (% cup) milk
- Mixed salad leaves to serve

Step 1: Preheat oven to 180°C. Spray a 20cm (base measurement) square cake pan with oil. Line base and sides with

Step 2: Heat oil in a large non-stick frying pan over medium-high heat. Stir-fry the vegetables for 3 minutes or until soft. Transfer to the prepared pan.

Step 3: Whisk eggs and milk in a bowl until combined. Season with salt and pepper. Pour over the vegetables. Bake for 25-30

Step 4: Set aside for 10 minutes to cool slightly. Serve with salad

Quick and Easy Pasta Salad

Prep time: 10 minutes Cooking time: 10 minutes Serves: 5

Ingredients:

- 250g dried pasta
- 1/2 cup sliced capsicum
- 1/2 cup thinly sliced zucchini 1/2 cup cherry tomatoes
- beans (or bocconcini)
- 1/2 cup pitted olives
- 1 cup grated cheese
- 1/2 cup fresh parsley or basil

Dressing


- 2 tbsp lemon juice
- 2 tbsp olive oil
- Pinch of salt
- Pepper to taste

Method:

1 cup rinsed and drained canned Step 1: Bring a pot of water to a boil. Add pasta and cook until tender, 6 to 10 minutes (check the package for cook time). Drain and rinse well

> Step 2: While the pasta cooks, in the bottom of a large bowl, make the dressing. Whisk the red wine vinegar, lemon juice, olive oil, salt and pepper until blended. Add the drained and rinsed pasta to the dressing

> Step 3: Stir in the capsicum, zucchini, tomatoes, canned beans, olives cheese, and the herbs (if using). Taste for seasoning and adjust as needed. Serve, or for the best results, cover and refrigerate for at least
