A Parting Reflection by our much loved Long-Serving Teacher and Curriculum Specialist Kelly Newman

In the last few Newsletters, we have been sharing results that have been gathered by Data Analyst, Stephen Russell. As a staff we were super proud to be told that what we are doing is making a real difference to the students we teach.

The students at St Joseph's are achieving results that are well above the expected outcome as predicted by a school's SES (Socio Economic Status).



We ask why this is the case and what are we doing that is having such a positive impact on our students? We can look at our Learning and Teaching Philosophy, in particular the Framework that underpins everything we do. The Four Pillars are:

Knowing The Learner

Getting to know the student's family, their strengths, challenges and interests that allows us to know what is impacting on the child's learning.

Building Positive Relationships

Building positive relationships that are the cornerstone of everything we do. Students are more likely to take risks with their learning if they feel supported, cared for and encouraged by their peers and their teachers.

Purposeful Learning

When learning is purposeful, students are at the centre. They are provided with opportunities to make connections and transfer their learning to different situations. Programs are designed and implemented that support and allow for this.

Purposeful Teaching

Purposeful teaching uses differentiated teaching strategies, data, observations and assessments. Purposeful teaching requires us to know what students know, need and want to know and what they will require to advance their skills and show growth.



St Joseph's aspires to create a Learning Environment that encompasses all of this, but more importantly decisions are made to support this Philosophy.



Our students are very lucky to have small classes our average class size is 17. We then support each Learning Area with extra staff. Each classroom pair has a Learning Support Officer (or two) and each Area has an extra teacher. This allows us to really hone in on student needs and then plan and teach accordingly. Teaching is differentiated, students are taught at their point of need. They are given the opportunity to work collaboratively, work with different teachers, they are extended where needed or intervention is provided to help them catch up.

We reflected on the other ways the 'whole child' is cared for at St Joseph's. Much time and effort goes into supporting students that are identified as having particular learning needs. Staff undergo Professional Development in order to understand different diagnoses. Ruth Hartnett-Carr works closely with families in this area and is a wealth of knowledge. Extra meetings with caregivers are provided and she liaises with the Catholic Education Office to access testing and support. We are very fortunate to have a Well Being Officer, Lainey Sutton. Lainey works closely with students that need some extra care and runs Social Skills Programs to support this. The students really are at the centre of all we do.



We often hear Mr Arnel say, "When opportunity knocks you should take it! Don't go to bed thinking If only or having regrets". Students at St Joseph's are encouraged to have a go and try different things, whether it is on the sporting field, in math competitions or in the arts. It is wonderful to see them thrive in their area of talent or interest or find out new things about themselves. Staff and Students are encouraged to be Leaders, to take their turn to step up and experience and develop the skills associated with this.



On a personal note, it has been a great privilege to work within the St Joseph's Community. As I finish off my time here, I can honestly say that this School and its Staff have the best interest of the students at its core. It is a school that has high expectations, but most of all it is a School that has a heart. I really do believe Mary MacKillop would be very proud of what we have achieved, but most importantly she would be grateful for the opportunities that are provided and for the love and care that every single one of our students is shown.

Thank you for trusting us with your treasures. They really are in good hands! Kelly Newman


