#### **Giving Tree**

As we begin advent, we begin our time thinking of giving to others. Part of this is our annual Vinnies Christmas Appeal. Stay tuned for more details to come in the coming weeks.

#### Preps

As Term 4 continues, it is hard to believe that our students are getting so close to the end of their Foundation year of school. They have been so busy recently, with an amazing term of learning, and we continue to see positive growth and development. We have begun preparation for Grade 1 by participating in transition sessions and discussing this regularly in the classroom.



#### Literacy

In Reading, it is wonderful to see our student's developing independence and confidence as they continue to use their learnt knowledge and skills, such as sounding out challenging words and aiming to improve fluency and expression. It is very important that the children practice their reading at home each day to consolidate what they are learning at school and that they continue to have their diaries signed. In Writing, we have been focusing on Fairy Tales. Our students are learning all about how to use adjectives to describe characters. Our writing lessons also include a daily routine of the students checking for appropriate punctuation and applying their letter/sound knowledge in order to sound out unknown words, to use their learnt common words, and to re-read for meaning. We are seeing a great improvement in writing which is wonderful to see!





#### **Numeracy**

In Numeracy, the children have continued their daily counting to 100 or higher and skip counting by 10's, 5's and 2's. They have also been challenged with the task of adding and subtracting using double digit numbers where appropriate. Next week, our Preps will begin learning about measurement, including comparing heavy and light objects, and also experimenting with capacity. We have been so impressed with our student's general improvement in Maths and their ability to solve problems, especially using mental strategies which places them in an excellent position as they are soon to enter Year 1 next year.

#### **Religion**

In Religion, the children have been learning about ways in which 'We Can Talk to God' and looking at how 'God Knows Us and Loves Us.' During these topics we have been discussing ways in which we can talk to God through prayer as well as looking at what makes our family special and God's unconditional love for us. This week they have been introduced to the story of the birth of Jesus, which they will perform to families towards the end of the term.

#### **Junior School**

Once again, we have some really exciting things happening over the coming weeks and we are looking forward to continuing to celebrate our amazing year together. #### **Sleepover and Fun Day**



What a wonderful time we had together where terrific memories were made. Our Grade 2 students took on the challenge of the sleepover with this being the first night away from home for many. It was pleasing to see all the laughter, smiles and how the students supported each other.

Every child participated in the activities and often went out of their comfort zone. We are proud of all of them!

#### **Robotics**

We had an Incursion where we learnt about Robotics. We used Makey Makey boards and our iPads to set up circuits in order to control games. This was a very exciting opportunity!

A small group of us were "Guinea Pigs" for Mr. Izzard's new purchase and how lucky we were. Children will have a chance to use them in the next few weeks. These are another coding tool that students can use to explore movement and location.







#### Literacy

In Literacy we are looking at Persuasive Writing. Children are given a statement, and they are required to share their opinion using emotive language. We have already had interesting debates on such things as "Teachers should wear uniforms" and "Fishing is fun".

In our recent testing we have been pleased to see the progress of students. We can see some rich language being used in their writing and students have the confidence to sound out the spelling of unknown words.

#### **Numeracy**

In Numeracy, we have been working on Multiplication and now we are looking at Division. We are investigating the connection between the two concepts and relating them to real life situations.

#### **Religion**

We are beginning the Unit on Advent. We have been using Art and Literature as Tuning-in activities. It has been amazing the way children have gained and shared insights into the artists' and authors' intentions.





#### **Inquiry - Creativity**

For our unit on Creativity, we have been exploring different ways we can create and be creative. We have loved seeing all students have a go at the different forms of showing their creativity (drawing, art, music, technology). We are currently exploring and comparing the movie and book of 'The Polar Express'. Students will then add their own creative twist to the story. This Unit is so exciting! Wait until you see our final project! Keep an eye on the foyer windows!!

#### **Swimming/Excursion**

In weeks 8 and 10 we will be doing swimming Lessons. Swimming will be a 30 min session on Monday/Wednesday and Friday. This is 6 sessions in total. This is a wonderful opportunity for children to build their confidence in the pool and have some fun with their peers. A note has been sent out on SIMON. #### **Literacy**

In Literacy, we are focusing on preparing our Grade 6's for Graduation where they are completing their student profiles, and our Grade 5's for Leadership roles and speeches. It has been a special time for each child, reflecting on all the wonderful memories they have made at our school, and looking forward to what's ahead. Students have been enjoying our novel 'Girl Underground' and have been dissecting the interesting characters in the story, and their text-to-self connections to Parliament House from their camp earlier in the year. Jamal and Bibi, from their previous novel, are featured in this novel, where we learn more about Australian Detention Centres.

#### **Numeracy**

We are busy revising many of the concepts covered throughout the year, such as our written addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division processes. At the same time, students are completing a Statistics and Probability Project, where they are creating their own survey questions to ask their peers, before recording the results in a graph. The students have also been working through their maths testing, one-on-one with their teachers, to see the areas of growth from this time last year.

#### <u>Inquiry</u>

Last week we presented our awesome 'Cardboard Game Arcade' for the middle school students to test. What an awesome way to showcase such unique pieces of work. Their designs, creativity, teamwork, and level of fun were enjoyed by all!

#### **Religion**

In these last weeks of Term, we are learning about Christmas and special holidays of countries around the world. We will be looking at our own family traditions, before moving on to traditions and



celebrations around the world. To wrap up the year, students will be researching a country of their choice and presenting their information through different methods.

#### **Upcoming Excursions**

We will finish our year off with a celebration day on Wednesday 6th December. Grade 6's will head to Funfields at Whittlesea, and Grade 5's will share a day out together in Cobram/Barooga with mini golf and a movie experience.
