SCHOOL FEES:

- Thank you for informing us of your preferred fee paying option. The families having fees directly debited DO NOT NEED TO DO ANYTHING.
- Could those families who are **NOT** using the Direct Debit option, PLEASE REMEMBER WHEN YOUR FEES **ARE DUE:**
 - ➤ One Yearly Payment due by 28th February
 - **Four Term Payments** due in the first 4 weeks of each term
 - ➤ <u>Ten Monthly Payments</u> these are due on the 18th of each month from February to November.
 - > Twenty Fortnightly Payments these commence on Friday the 9th February and continue every second Friday until the 1st November 2024.

If any family would like to commence having their fees directly debited fortnightly or monthly this can be done at any time!

If you are wanting to amend your payment options please do so ASAP.

CSEF

School fees will be sent home within the next week. If you now have a health care card and are eligible for the Camps, Sports & Excursion Fund (CSEF) please complete the attached CSEF Application form and hand to the office. Eligibility requirements & explanations are listed on the back of the form. If you received the fund last year & your circumstances haven't changed you do not need to complete the form again. If you have new children attending the school, you will need to complete a new form.

CONVEYANCE ALLOWANCE: 2024

To be eligible you must:

- ✓ Be the holder of a current Health Care Card or Pension Card (as with EMA)
- ✓ Be attending your closest Catholic Primary School
- ✓ Live 4.8 or more kilometres from **both** the school and your nearest bus stop by the shortest practical route
- Your child is using the free government run buses if available.

If you meet these criteria and would like to apply, please contact the School Office as soon as possible.

The Claim deadline for Term 1 is 1st March. It would be best to apply well before that date in case the Dept has any queries regarding your claim.

Following your application, your eligibility is decided by Centrelink and the Transport Department.

As a school we continue to use SIMON which is a Learning Management Program that is being used by many Catholic schools in the region. An important part of the SIMON program is the Parent Access Module (PAM) which provides a portal to improve the communication between parents and the school. PAM makes life a little easier, as well as being far more environmentally friendly with less paper work going home in the bottom of school bags!

Benefits of PAM are that families can:

- get the most up to date information and resources regarding what's happening at school
- inform the school of your child/s absence or late arrival
- update child/s medical medical information
- be informed if your child/ren have needed First Aid during a school day
- provide consent for excursions & school activities.
- View student assessment (school reports)

To register and use PAM please make sure you have completed the following:

- Update child/s medical information

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Camps, Sports and Excursions fund eligibility

Below are the criteria used to determine a student's eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF).

Criteria 1 - Eligibility

To be eligible* for the fund, a mature minor of sixteen years of age or over, a parent or legal guardian of a student attending a registered Government or non-government Victorian primary or secondary school must:

- · on the first day of Term one, or;
- · on the first day of Term two.
- a) Be an eligible beneficiary within the meaning of the State Concessions Act 2004, that is, be a holder of Veterans Affairs Gold Card or be an eligible Centrelink Health Care Card (HCC) or Pensioner Concession Card (PCC) holder, OR.
- b) Be a temporary foster parent, and;
- c) Submit an application to the school by the due date.
- * A special consideration eligibility category also exists. For more information, see: <u>Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund</u> (CSEF): Eligibility | education.vic.gov.au

Mature minors or parents who receive a Carer Allowance on behalf of a child, or any other benefit or allowance not income tested by Centrelink, are not eligible for the CSEF unless they also comply with one of (a) or (b) above.

Criteria 2 - Be of school age and attend school in Victoria

School is compulsory for all Victorian children aged between six and seventeen years of age inclusive.

For the purposes of CSEF, students may be eligible for assistance if they attend a Victorian registered primary or secondary school. Typically, these students are aged between five and eighteen years inclusive.

CSEF is not payable to students attending pre-school, kindergarten, home schooling, or TAFE.

Eligibility Date

For concession card holders, CSEF eligibility will be subject to the parent/legal guardian's concession card being successfully validated with Centrelink on 29 January 2024 and/or 15 April 20204.

Payment amounts

CSEF payment amount

The CSEF is an annual payment to the school to be used towards camps, sports and/or excursion expenses for the benefit of the eligible student.

- Primary school student rate: \$150.00 per year.
- Secondary school student rate: \$250.00 per year.

The CSEF is paid directly the school and will be allocated by the school towards camps, sports and/or excursion costs for your child.

For ungraded students, the rate payable is determined by the student's date of birth. For more information, see: <u>Camps.</u> Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF): Payment amounts | education.vic.gov.au

Foundation and Year 7 government school students who are CSEF recipients are also eligible for a uniform voucher. Schools are required to make applications on behalf of parents, so please register your interest at the school.

How to complete the application form

NOTE: ALL SECTIONS MUST BE COMPLETED BY PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN

- Complete the PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN DETAILS section.
 Make sure that the Surname, First Name, and Customer Reference Number (CRN) details match those on your concession card. You will also need to provide your concession card to the school.
 - If you are claiming as a Foster Parent or a Veteran Affairs Pensioner, you will need to provide a copy of documentation confirming your status as a temporary Foster Parent or provide your Veterans Affairs Pensioner Gold card to the school.
- 2. Complete the STUDENT/S DETAILS section for students at this school.
- Sign and date the form and return it to the school office as soon as possible. The CSEF program for 2024 closes at the end of term two 2024.

CSEF payments cannot be claimed retrospectively for prior years.

Queries relating to CSEF eligibility and payments should be directed to the school.
