2025 School Fees

This is the Annual Fee Schedule for 2025 approved by last night's meeting of the School Advisory Council. It is set to rise below the CPI. We have had to increase Excursion fees in the Middles and Seniors to cover rising costs. We have allocated a \$75 Technology levy per Student, where previously it was \$100 per family. New laptops and i.pads will be purchased in the next few years.

As we begin advent, we begin our time thinking of giving to others. Part of this is our annual Vinnies Christmas Appeal. Stay tuned for more details to come in the coming weeks.

Preps

As Term 4 continues, it is hard to believe that our students are getting so close to the end of their Foundation year of school. They have been so busy recently, with an amazing term of learning, and we continue to see positive growth and development. We have begun preparation for Grade 1 by participating in transition sessions and discussing this regularly in the classroom.

Literacy

In Reading, it is wonderful to see our students developing independence and confidence as they continue to use their learnt knowledge and skills, such as sounding our challenging words, aiming to improve fluency and expression. It is very important that the children practice their reading at home each day to consolidate what they are learning at school and that they continue to have their diaries signed.

Numeracy

In Numeracy, the children have continued their daily counting to 100 or higher and skip counting by 10's, 5's and 2's. We have been learning about measurement, including comparing heavy and light objects, and also experimenting with capacity. We have been so impressed with our student's general improvement in Maths and their ability to solve problems, especially using mental strategies which places them in an excellent position as they are soon to enter Year 1 next year.

Religion

In Religion, the children have been learning about ways in which 'We Can Talk to God' and looking at how 'God Knows Us and Loves Us.' During these topics we have been discussing ways in which we can talk to God through prayer as well as looking at what makes our family special and God's unconditional love for us. This week they have been introduced to the story of the birth of Jesus, which they will perform to families towards the end of the term.

Swimming

Next week we begin swimming lessons. We will be going to the indoor pool on Monday, Wednesday and Friday of Week 8 & 9. This experience is an excellent opportunity for the children, and we are really looking forward to it.

Inquiry

For our unit on Creativity we have been exploring different ways we can create and be creative. We have loved seeing all students have a go at the different forms of showing their creativity (drawing, art, music, technology). In the coming weeks students will be designing their own marionet puppet. If you have small boxes, not much bigger than the hand, we would love for you to bring these in. Thanks in advance.

Literacy Block

Students are currently finishing publishing their own version of the Gruffalo. So keep an eye out for them coming home after we present them to the Preps.

In our recent testing we have been pleased to see the progress of students. We can see some rich language being used in their writing and students have the confidence to sound out the spelling of unknown words in both Reading and Writing.

Religion

As part of our study into growth/change/grief and loss, we have discussed feelings and ways in which we can look after our feelings. Students were very excited to create their own gardens and love checking in daily to see how much their seeds have grown. We are beginning the Unit on Advent.



Swimming Lessons

In weeks 8 and 9 we will be doing swimming Lessons. Swimming will be a 30 min session on Monday/Wednesday and Friday. This is 6 sessions in total. This is a wonderful opportunity for children to build their confidence in the pool and have some fun with their peers. A note has been sent out on SIMON. Literacy

In Literacy, we are focusing on preparing our Grade 6's for Graduation where they are completing their student profiles, and our Grade 5's for Leadership roles and speeches. It has been a special time for each child, reflecting on all the wonderful memories they have made at our school, and looking forward to what's ahead. Students have also continued their novel study about "Once" and have continued to dissect the interesting characters and plotlines in the story. We have been using this story as the basis for our information report about Poland, where the story is set.

Numeracy

We are busy revising many of the concepts covered throughout the year, such as our written addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division processes. At the same time, students are completing a Statistics and Probability Project which has been put to them by the NSW Department of Sport. Students are analysing data about Camp Borambola to decide which activity should be removed, and what should be added in its place.

Inquiry

Last week we presented our fantastic Board-Games for the Middle School students to test. So much effort and thought went into their creation, and we hope that they are also a hit at home! Our Seniors also took on the role of PE teachers when they held a Tabloid Sports event for the local Kinder kids. It was impressive to see our students step outside of their comfort zone and take on a leadership role for those younger children.

Religion

In these last weeks of Term, we are learning about Christmas and special holidays of countries around the world. We will be looking at our own family traditions, before moving on to traditions and celebrations around the world.

As we head towards Christmas, we look to finish our year off with a celebration on Tuesday 3rd December.

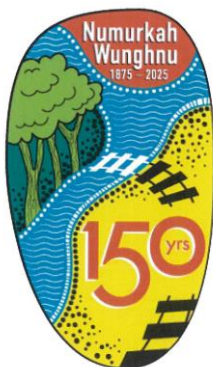

What do we bring?
