At our Monday assembly, **Middle B and M/B** led a thoughtful and respectful prayer and reflection, helping us all focus on the importance of listening, understanding, and walking together towards a more inclusive future. Their message reminded us that every step we take in kindness and respect brings us closer to reconciliation.

Preps

What a wonderful journey of living and learning it has been in Term 2! As we reach Week 7, it's incredible to reflect on how much our Prep students have grown—both in confidence and curiosity. From exploring new sounds and numbers to building friendships and routines, every day has been filled with moments of discovery and joy. We're so proud of all they've achieved so far and look forward to the rest of the term with excitement!

Literacy

In Literacy, we are continuing with our InitiaLit lessons. Each session begins with a review of the letters and sounds we've learned so far, helping to reinforce the children's growing knowledge. The students also spend time reading and writing words, applying their skills in meaningful ways. A key part of our lessons includes learning and practising Tricky Words—these are common words that often appear in books but include sounds we haven't yet formally learned.

Your child has a list of Tricky Words, along with the sounds we've covered, in their reader folder. We encourage you to spend 5–10 minutes each evening practising these with your child. Readers will be changed on the day your child reads with their teacher. Thank you for your ongoing support at home!

Numeracy

In Numeracy we have completed our topics on part/whole numbers and shapes. This week we have moved onto counting and place value. The children will be extending their knowledge on numbers and working with numbers 0-10 and 10 and beyond.

Religion

In Religion, students have been focusing on the unit 'God knows us and loves us. Students have been exploring the ways in which God loves us and understanding that God's love can be revealed through our families, friends and creation.

<u>Inquiry</u>

In Inquiry students have been learning about where we live on the Map. The children have explored what town they live in, what state our town is in and our Country Australia. During this time, we have talked about special places in Australia as well as exploring different places we have visited.

Juniors


As we reach the end of Term 2 we would like to congratulate you all. Your children have done a fantastic job this semester and we are all proud of their achievements.

Literacy Year 1

Students have explored vowel sounds and spelling; we are now focusing on other digraphs and split digraphs commonly used such as er, ir, ur, ar and or.

Our word study has been around plurals and suffixes. We continue to explore writing Super Sentences and have seen some great creativity and incorporation of our vocabulary from storybook lessons.

In Writing, we have been using the InitiaLit Storyslide to plan for narrative writing. Students are writing their own version of the "Bear's don't" based on our mentor text "Bear's don't read" by Emma Chichester Clark.



Literacy Year 2

In Reading, students have been working on the comprehension strategy of asking questions. They have explored a shared text and practised using the question words "Who? Where? What? When? How? Why?" before, during, and after reading to deepen their understanding. In Writing, students have started exploring fractured fairy tales, focusing on retelling the well-known story The Three Little Pigs in a new and creative way.

In Spelling, students have focused on the

digraphs 'ow' as in cow and 'ou' as in cloud. They have learnt that while it can be tricky to know which digraph to use, one helpful rule is that 'ou' usually does not appear at the end of a word—so we use 'ow' in that case. When the /ow/ sound appears at the beginning or in the middle of a word, we often just need to learn which digraph is correct.

In Grammar, students have continued learning about sentence structure, with a particular focus on verbs and their role within a sentence.

<u>Maths</u>

We have spent much of the term exploring Place Value and understanding how numbers work. It has been great to see students working with concrete materials and getting confident in their recognition of the values digits have within a number. One of the fun ways we explore our maths topics is through maths games. A simple pack of cards or a die can be used to make many games to practice number skills.

The last 2 weeks we have looked at length and comparing length with informal measurement. Students had plenty of fun measuring objects around our room.




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<u>Inquiry</u>

Our theme 'Worldly wonders' fitted perfectly into National Sorry day and Reconciliation Week last week. Students have explored Australia and the nation's first peoples. We had some great discussions and questions asked about the history of Australia.

Over the next few weeks, we will be creating some triaramas to display our learning about Australia, Victoria, Numurkah and their homes. Students are already very excited about getting creative. We hope to have an open session towards the end of Term for families to come into our classrooms to see their work.

Religion

In Religion we are continuing to explore the Church and how Baptism

welcomes us into the Church community. In the coming weeks we will explore how Jesus was baptised and how we are called to live like Jesus and show God's love for all, through the things we say and do. We have started exploring the idea of belonging and how you are initiated into new groups (school, football/netball clubs, scouts, etc).

It would be a great discussion to have in your family about whether your child was baptised, show them photos and share your feelings about this special time in their lives.

Middles

We've officially passed the halfway point of Term 2, and with winter well and truly upon us, it's been lovely to see students rugged up and embracing their learning with enthusiasm! A friendly reminder that full winter uniform is now required, including sports uniform on PE days—Middle North has PE on Fridays, and Middle South has PE on Wednesdays, following the recent specialist timetable swap.

In Literacy, we wrap up our novel study of *Yirra and Her Deadly Dog, Demon* this week. The students have thoroughly enjoyed this story and have been working hard on their factual recount writing. Next, we dive into *Off We Go Around Australia*, a new novel that will help us explore explanatory writing. We'll finish the term with a unit on Australian Poetry—a great chance for students to connect with our culture and rhythm through verse.

In Numeracy, we are moving at pace through several exciting units! We've worked through fractions, length and area, and data representations, and we'll be diving into shape next week. We'll wrap up the term revising addition and subtraction strategies.

In **Inquiry**, we've launched our five-week **Junior Public Speaking unit**, in partnership with the Lions Club. Students are planning, drafting, editing, and rehearsing speeches in response to the theme: "*If you could invent something new, what would it be*?" Our school finals will be held in **Week 11**, with the top four students progressing to the next stage in **Term 3**. We're already hearing some incredibly creative ideas!

In **Religion**, our focus remains on celebrating the **gift of the Holy Spirit** and recognising how God's presence is seen in the world around us. Students have enjoyed researching famous individuals who display these spiritual qualities—ask your child who they've been studying!

Supporting Social and Emotional Growth

In the Middles, we are committed to helping our students develop strong **social and emotional skills**. Each week, **Amanda, Laura, Bern, Di and Jordyn** run small group sessions where students engage in **cooking and board games**, each with a focus on a specific social skill. These sessions have not only helped students grow in confidence but also strengthened important life skills such as teamwork, communication, and positive interaction.

Additionally, **Sam Carnie** facilitates the **Chill Skills Program**, where students learn how to identify and manage their emotions, while building effective strategies to support their wellbeing. These targeted programs have had a wonderful impact on our students' personal growth.









Live Life Whole

On Thursday the 8th of May, our middle area girls participated in a fun-filled and interactive program ran by Megan Dickinson (a past student) and Co-Founder of the Live Life Whole Project. The girls explored three important topics:

Nuture- Emotions and Friendships

Align- Self Confidence, self-esteem and self-talk

Believe- What's important to us and why

They played games, danced, created super-hero poses, followed interactive slides and sang all whilst covering important topics about their health and well-being. The girls participated with enthusiasm and eagerness. What a great day together, sharing about our thoughts and beliefs and getting some positive, inspirational tips to guide us as we grow together.
