



Literacy

In Reading, the students have been working hard to build stamina as they now know how to sound out and decode new and challenging words. It is great to see our students improving their confidence as they are developing a self awareness of being able to read for meaning and enjoyment. This has been supported through our daily InitiaLit sessions.

In Writing, the students have been learning how to structure and extend simple sentences by including the When, Who, What and Where. We are encouraging our students to develop their own ideas by thinking about "who" their writing is about, "what" events take place", "when" did the events happen and "where" are the characters. It is wonderful to see the students' writing really beginning to emerge, improve and grow at this time of the school year.

Numeracy

In Numeracy, our students have been exploring the exciting world of addition and subtraction. They've been using picture stories to help them understand and solve number problems, and engaging in lots of hands-on activities to build their skills. From using counters and blocks to drawing their own math stories, the children have been working hard and having fun while developing a strong understanding of these important concepts.

Religion

In Religion, the students have been learning about 'Our Church.' They have developed their understanding of belonging as it relates to family, school, community and parish. We have identified the Church as a community of people who come together to celebrate faith and discussed that when we celebrate as a Church community, we feel like family.

Inquiry

In Inquiry, the children have been learning about living and nonliving things. The children have been exploring the difference and discussing the difference between needs and wants.

Juniors

Term 3 is already flying by. The children have all returned very settled and eager to continue living and learning together. We have some exciting things happening this term and we look forward to enjoying them together.

We have some changes around our Junior West Team. Clara Lukies is on placement for her teaching degree weeks 2-6, so Ally Kiesskalt has moved into Junior West. Also to replace Jane who left us at the end of Term 2, we welcome Jordyn Commadeur to the Junior West Team.

In Junior East we have Shay and Shannon continuing as LSO's.

Seesaw

If you are not connected to your child's Seesaw account, please contact your child's teacher. This is where we will be sending a weekly schedule and updates on our learning.

InitiaLit

We have jumped straight back into our Year 1 and Year 2 InitiaLit lessons.

Year 1 students have been doing a review of our 'bossy e' words and learning about the suffix 'ed' meaning past tense. We continue daily reviews of our previously taught sounds and tricky words. This week Year 1 students will be getting a keyring of tricky words, that we will add to as we learn new ones. We encourage students to practice reading and spelling these words.

Year 2 students have been learning about the silent letter spellings such as 'b' in thumb, 'k' in knee and 'w' in wrap. The current comprehension strategy is inferring with students using clues in the text and what they already know to infer the meaning of words in a text.







Last week some of the Juniors had the opportunity to do free writing outside in the sunshine. It was a great inspiration, and students loved sharing their stories when we got back inside. Lucky they were made up as we had quite a few dragons come and breathe fire on the oval.




Numeracy

In the first 2 weeks of this term, we explored 2D and 3D shapes. Students loved getting their hands on shapes and some of the fun activities involving creating and building with different shapes. We now move onto a focus of multiplication and division for 4 weeks. The learning intentions for multiplication and division are around helping students understand and represent equal grouping and sharing situations using physical and visual materials.













Religion

Our first Religion topic for this term is 'Jesus' Story'. Students will learn about Jesus from the four Gospels. They will begin to understand that he is important in our lives today as the one who shows us the way. As an introduction to the unit, we have been exploring the idea of stories and understanding their importance. Students have been recalling some stories from their own lives.

Inquiry

We believe Inquiry is the most popular topic this term with our focus around Science. As it is such a broad topic, we will begin our term looking at Chemical Science and then finish the second half of the term exploring biological science. We are very excited that as part of the biological science aspect we will be going to the Kyabram Fauna Park to work with zookeepers and see some real-life animals. To start our fun unit of science, we learned about the different types of scientists and students got to design their own scientist stating what type they would like to be. Amongst us we have biologists, zoologists, paleontologists, marine biologists, computer scientists and astronomers.

Middles

As we push through the winter grind and look ahead to the promise of spring, it's been wonderful to see students continuing to uphold our strong routines and high expectations, both in their learning and how they treat one another. The positive energy across the middle years has been fantastic.

Tomorrow, we are excited to celebrate the **Feast Day of Saint Mary MacKillop**, with our Middle students playing a key role in the morning Mass and many participating in the "**Let Your Light**"

Shine" performances in the afternoon. It's shaping up to be a special day of faith, celebration and student leadership.

In **Literacy**, we are currently exploring the novel *The Iron Man* by Ted Hughes. This captivating story follows a mysterious metal giant who appears in the countryside, causing confusion and fear before ultimately becoming a hero. Alongside this, students are writing **information reports** about iron, linking literacy with our science and inquiry learning. This unit will wrap up at the end of Week 5, after which we will begin reading the timeless classic *Charlotte's Web* by E.B. White. Students will learn the key features of a narrative and focus on planning, composing, and publishing high-quality stories of their own.





Our **Inquiry focus** this term is geography, from local to global. Students are developing their understanding of Australia's place in the world, as well as the diverse countries and cultures we are connected to.

In **Religious Education**, we are exploring **Jesus' parables** and the powerful life lessons they offer. Students have been sharing thoughtful reflections and are beginning to see how these stories can shape their own lives and values.





We're also continuing to focus on the **little things that make our school great**, including taking pride in wearing the correct school uniform. A reminder:

- Middle North students wear their sports uniform on Wednesdays only
- Middle South students wear theirs on Fridays only

We're looking forward to **hosting Assembly this coming Monday**. Middle North will be leading, and every student has a part to play, we'd love to see families there supporting them.

Inquiry

In Inquiry we are currently studying a topic we have called "Paddock to Plate." This topic is mainly about foods grown in our region and how they eventually end up on ours, and others, plates.
