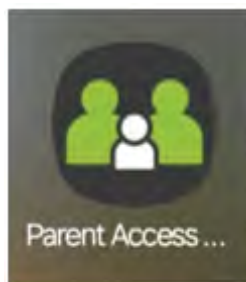

Foundation School News

It is hard to believe that our students are already working through Week 3 of Term 3! The students have settled back into our living and learning routines well and we are excited by the opportunities this term will provide.

Literacy

In Literacy, students have been learning the digraphs **sh**, **ff**, **ll**, **ss**, and **ck**, using these sounds to build confidence in reading and spelling. We have also continued practising tricky words and developing spoken and written sentences, with a focus on using capital letters, finger spaces, and full stops.

Numeracy

In Numeracy, we have been exploring **addition and subtraction** using **ten frames**, **number tracks**, and **pictorial equations**. Students are developing confidence in solving problems, explaining their thinking, and applying a range of strategies to build strong number knowledge.

HASS - Humanities and Social Sciences.

Our HASS learning has focused on the **features of familiar places** and the important places in our community. Students have explored how we are connected to these places and discussed simple ways we can care for and protect them.

Religious Education

In Religious Education, students have been learning about the **Bible**, discovering what it is made up of and why it is a special book for Christians. We have also explored what makes something special and how people show care and respect for things that are important to them.

Junior School News

A Wonderful Start to Term!

Our Junior students have truly hit the ground running this term! It has been fantastic to see how smoothly our Grade 1 and 2 students have transitioned back into school life. With strong routines firmly in place, students are feeling confident, settled and ready to engage in their learning each day. We are looking forward to an exciting term filled with learning, discovery, creativity and plenty of fun along the way!

English

Thank you to families for supporting our home reading program. It has been wonderful to see students bringing their Reader Folders to school each day and having their diaries signed by parents and carers. Don't forget to check out the activities at the back of the folders to further support your child's learning at home.

In class, students are continuing with the InitialLit program as we review previously learned sounds, letter combinations and spelling patterns. This helps build a strong foundation for reading success.

In Writing, students have been exploring persuasive texts. We have been learning how authors share their opinions and support them with convincing reasons and examples. Students have enjoyed creating persuasive pieces about topics they are passionate about and are developing their ability to justify their thinking.

Mathematics

This term, our students have been busy developing their maths skills through hands-on learning activities.

Grade 1 students have been learning about measurement and patterns. They have been comparing lengths, heights and capacities, as well as identifying and creating repeating patterns. Students have enjoyed exploring these concepts through games and practical classroom activities.

Grade 2 students have been focusing on multiplication, division and shape. They have been learning how numbers can be grouped and shared equally, while also investigating

the features of 2D and 3D shapes. Through hands-on experiences, students are building confidence and becoming more flexible mathematical thinkers.

Religion

Our current unit, Daily Life in Jesus' Time, has already provided some memorable learning experiences! Recently, students explored foods that people may have eaten during the time of Jesus. Let's just say some students were asking for seconds, while others were politely wondering where the chicken nuggets were! We are incredibly proud of every student for being brave and willing to try something new.

Throughout this unit, students will learn about Jesus and discover what life in Nazareth may have been like during His time. They will explore the daily lives of people who lived then and make connections between the experiences of people in Jesus' time and their own lives today.

Science

In Science, students are investigating the Structure of Matter.

Students are learning to:

Explore how materials can be combined in different ways for particular purposes.

Describe how mixtures can have different properties from the materials used to make them.

Predict and compare how different materials can be combined to create useful products.

One of our favourite learning experiences so far has been investigating how foods can be mixed to create new products such as jelly and playdough.

RRRR

Our current RRRR focus is 'Help Seeking.' Students are learning how to solve small problems, build positive friendships and identify trusted people they can turn to when they need support. These skills help students develop confidence, resilience and positive relationships.

Our next topic will be 'Gender Norms and Stereotypes,' where students will explore their own strengths and





interests, learn to appreciate differences and challenge stereotypes in a positive and age-appropriate way.

Specialists & Kitchen Garden

Students have been thoroughly enjoying their Specialist classes and Kitchen Garden sessions. These experiences provide valuable opportunities for creativity, teamwork, skill development, and hands-on learning.

Middle School News

Term 3 is always an exciting time in the school year. While winter is still making itself known, there are already signs that spring is just around the corner. The days are becoming a little longer, the birds are beginning to sing a little louder, and the smell of freshly cut grass is starting to fill the air. For many of us, those signs can only mean one thing: footy finals season is fast approaching.

The students have returned from the holidays with enthusiasm and have quickly settled back into their learning routines. It has been wonderful to see so many students reconnect with their classmates, embrace classroom expectations and continue building upon the excellent work established throughout the first half of the year.

Throughout Term 3, students will continue their learning across English, Mathematics, Science, Humanities, Religion and the Four Rs, our wellbeing program that supports students in developing resilience, positive relationships and personal wellbeing.

English

Students have begun studying the Australian classic *Storm Boy*. This much-loved novel provides opportunities for rich discussion, comprehension and critical thinking. In Writing, students will focus on the Information Report genre, developing their ability to research, organise and present information effectively.

Mathematics

This term students will be exploring:

- Multiplication and Division
- Angles
- Time
- Decimals
- Mass and Capacity

Science

In Science, students will investigate Motion and the forces that influence movement. Later in the term, they will explore Colour and develop an understanding of how light affects the way we see and experience the world around us.

Humanities

Students will be studying Managing Earth's Resources, learning about sustainability, conservation and the responsible use of natural resources.

Religion

In Religion, students will be exploring the Gift of the Spirit and developing a deeper understanding of how the Holy Spirit guides and strengthens us in our daily lives.

Four Rs

Students will continue participating in our Four Rs wellbeing program, focusing on resilience, respectful relationships, self awareness and positive wellbeing practices.

Senior School News

Dear Parents and Caregivers,

We are certainly back into routine, with many exciting opportunities on the horizon! Over the past three weeks, students have been developing their skills in Football, Netball or Tee ball in preparation for the Lightning Premiership this Friday. We have also begun rehearsals for our Year 5/6 production, *When I Grow Up*, with students working diligently to learn their lines and familiarise themselves with the story line.

A special congratulations to Emma, Mikayla, Kade, Myah and Jack, who all confidently presented their speeches to the Lions Club judges. We extend a particular congratulations to Emma, who was selected to progress to the next stage, and to Jack, who was awarded runner up.

Literacy

We have commenced our study of the class novel *Once* by Morris Gleitzman. The novel follows Felix, a young Jewish boy living in Poland during World War II, who embarks on a journey to find his parents and discovers the harsh realities of the war. Through Felix's story, students will explore themes of courage, hope, friendship and resilience. All literacy learning for the first half of this term will be linked to the text. In Writing, students have been learning about Poland, the setting of our focus novel, and will develop their understanding of information reports before applying these skills in their own writing.

Numeracy

To begin the term, students completed a two week unit on fractions, where they learnt to identify equivalent fractions and add and subtract fractions with like and unlike denominators.

Our next unit of learning will focus on angles. Students will learn how to measure, draw and classify different types of angles. They will also explore angle relationships and use their understanding to calculate unknown angles.

Religion

Throughout the unit 'In God's Image', students will explore their identity and sense of belonging as individuals,

members of the Church community and followers of Jesus. They will learn that every person is created in God's image with unique gifts, and consider how their choices can reflect values such as kindness, respect, justice and care for others.

Science

In the unit *Manipulating Light*, students will investigate how light behaves in everyday situations, including how it reflects, bends and passes through different materials. Through hands on experiments, they will explore how we see colours and images and apply their learning by creating and testing a simple pinhole camera.

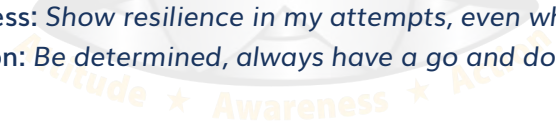
